North Dakota State Commission on National and Community Service is a 15-member board who are appointed by the Governor. Federal AmeriCorps resources from the Corporation for National and Community Service are awarded to organizations seeking to deliver services through an evidence based approach creating community solutions. Veterans and their families, people with disabilities, and older adults will be priority populations to serve as AmeriCorps members and volunteers. Management efforts will continue towards solutions that reach beyond continuous government support. In addition, the ND State Commission will support organizations that model delivery systems that address one or more of the following focus areas:

1. North Dakota State Commission volunteer initiative
 - a. Support development of organizational capacity to increase the quantity and quality of North Dakota's volunteers.
 - b. Attract, Retain, and Expand North Dakota's volunteers.
 - c. Develop new service opportunities through workshops, town halls, and trainings.
 - d. Support cross sector collaboration as a service strategy to increase the number of volunteers

 - b. Survey to evaluate the member experience.
 - c. Increase awareness of AmeriCorps in North Dakota.
 - d. Recruitment and retention of AmeriCorps members.

3. North Dakota State Commission board members and program staff will promote the mission and goals of community service
